


- updating personnel policies

Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

THE CEDAR'S 23RD SEASON SAW CONSIDERABLE GROWTH AND IMPROVEMENT IN EVERYTHING FROM OUR PROGRAMMING ROSTER TO OUR BUILDING'S FUNCTIONALITY. Our programming continues to embody the heart and soul of The Cedar, and the past two years have been particularly gratifying for our mission, which is focused on global music. We have seen Twin Cities' debuts from a wide range of artists from all over the world, including legends such as Tony Allen (Nigeria) and Shalom Hanuch (Israel), traditional music talents such as Son de Madera (Mexico) and Maraca (Cuba), and groundbreaking pioneers like Bombo Estéreo (Colombia) and Omar Souleyman (Syria). The Cedar also continues to provide an intimate listening experience for genres extending beyond global music. In partnership with organizations such as First Avenue, Walker Art Center, and Sue McLean & Associates, The Cedar has hosted memorable performances by Mavis Staples, tUnE-yArDs, Volcano Choir, Billy Bragg, Sharon Van Etten, Bill Frisell, and more.

Thanks to funding from the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund with money from the Legacy Amendment distributed through the Minnesota State Arts Board, we have significantly expanded our outreach to the local Somali community, the largest group of residents in our neighborhood. These efforts have included community events, ticket donations to Cedar shows, residencies with artists of particular interest to this community, and ongoing partnerships with East African organizations to further our respective missions.

Last summer, The Cedar took a major step in updating our 1948 facility with the installation of new HVAC units for the performance hall. This dramatically improves our ability to heat and cool the building while providing a muchneeded ventilation upgrade. This improvement provides us with more options for summer programming.

All of these achievements happened because of four consecutive years of modest budget surpluses, made possible with annual support from our donors. Inspired programming, stable foundation and government funding, strong donor support, and a commitment to improving patron experience continue to provide a successful formula for The Cedar Cultural Center.

Here's to the next 23 seasons!



We have solidified our position as the country's premiere presenter of world music with our Global Roots program, which includes an annual Global Roots Festival and performance series such as West Africa, West Bank, Música Latina, African Summer, and Jewels of India. We hosted our fourth Global Roots Festival in 2012, which presents innovative artists from around the world playing contemporary music with traditional roots. The three-day festival was completely free of charge for the second year in a row and included educational programs for youth in partnership with Project SUCCESS and public school classrooms. In 2012, The Cedar won New York Times affiliate About.com's Readers' Choice Award for Best World Music Venue, competing against organizations in Berkeley, Chicago, London, and Brooklyn.

The Cedar presents over 200 concerts, educational

The Cedar maintains the vibrancy and diversity of the arts in Minnesota by providing accessible, high-quality creative and cultural experiences. Our core, mission-driven programs present arts from different traditions and engage people from various cultures in order to facilitate intercultural interaction and further diversity learning. Our





The mission of The Cedar Cultural Center is to promote intercultural appreciation and understanding through the presentation of global music and dance. The Cedar is committed to artistic excellence and integrity, diversity of programming, support for emerging artists, and community outreach. initiatives also focus on supporting local artists, increasing access to the arts, and using the arts to solve community problems.

Over the past five years, The Cedar has increased the number and diversity of people we serve annually: In 2008, we served 30,000 people. In 2009 and 2010, this jumped to 48,000, in 2011, we served over 52,000 community members, and we are on track to reach even more people in 2012. This is the result of strategic and diverse programming, increased number and quality of partnerships, improved access programs, and innovative marketing efforts. We maintain active social media accounts: You can check us out on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Tumblr, or our mobile app, and we also have a monthly print calendar. Consistent audience growth is a clear ndication that The Cedar's services are meeting a community demand.

The Cedar's neighborhood, Cedar Riverside, covers about one square mile and houses 8,000 residents, mostly low-income immigrants and refugees from Somalia. With this community's rising influence on Minnesota's culture and economy, it is increasingly important for the greater community to understand and connect with our Somali neighbors and to support and cultivate their future leaders. This is a natural role for The Cedar: We are the leading nonprofit in the neighborhood home to the most Somalis outside of East Africa, and our mission centers on intercultural appreciation. This community faces many challenges, and The Cedar brings groups together to alleviate community problems and provides a platform for community building.

In our 23rd season, we expanded and improved our services to K-12 public school students and families by increasing our number of artist residencies and workshops and strengthening our partnerships with organizations such as Project SUCCESS, Project for Pride in Living, Brian Coyle Center, Cedar Riverside Community School, and Ka Joog Nonprofit. We worked on increasing access to

live music for people with disabilities with special performances in partnership with Courage Center, Interact Center, and WorkAbilities.



Season Highlights

IN SEPTEMBER 2012, THE CEDAR LAUNCHED ITS 24TH SEASON presenting music from all over the world. As we reach the midway point of another season of great performances, we look back on the highlights of our 23rd season and the first half of our 24th.



FALL 2011

We kicked off The Cedar's 23rd season in September 2011 with a free concert featuring our favorite Swedish trio, Väsen. Several weeks later, we presented our 3rd annual Global Roots Festival: Three days of free international music including workshops and performances by Malian kora master Ballaké Sissoko with French cellist Vincent Segal; the psychedelic electronic cumbia of Bomba Esteréo from Colombia; Polish folk band Dikanda; Malian bluesmen Sidi Touré Trio; and Dominican merengue master Joaquin Diaz.

Around the same time, we launched a crowdfunding mechanism called **Cedar Seeder**, which allows patrons to support

creative music projects and helps to guide our booking decisions with advance ticket sales. A successful Cedar Seeder project funded a performance by **Mount Eerie**, aka Phil Elverum, of beloved indie band **The Microphones** on Labor Day when we are historically closed. Go to **cedarseeder.org** to check out other concerts and projects.



In October, we presented a sold-out concert by indie folk darlings **The Head and The Heart** on the evening of the annual West Bank **Zombie Pub Craw**I; 700 music fans inside The Cedar and over 10,000 zombies on the streets made for a memorable night. Other notable concerts in October 2011 included Senegal's **Baaba Maal**, Ireland's **Karan Casey** and the Milwaukee funk outfit **Kings Go Forth**. One of the highlights of the month was a concert and daytime educational program from **Debo Band**, a big brass band based out of Boston whose music is rooted in the traditions of Ethiopia.

In early November, Malian griot **Bassekou Kouyate** and **Ngoni Ba**, who wowed Cedar audiences in 2010, returned for a concert and daytime program. Later that month, gospel legends **The Blind Boys of Alabama** and local singer-songwriter **Jeremy Messersmith** both performed to sold-out crowds. After hosting her in our hall twice before, The Cedar presented indie artist **tUnE-yArDs** at First Avenue; she went on to co-headline Walker Art Center's popular Rock The Garden Festival in summer 2012.

Thanksgiving weekend is historically packed with top-rate artists, and 2011 was no exception: **Marketa Irglova** of The Swell Season performed songs from her first solo record to an adoring crowd and Tuareg exrebel fighters from the Sahara, **Tinariwen**, brought the desert blues back to the Twin Cities. As usual, the holiday season saw a schedule

full of local artists including our annual **Dosh** holiday show and **The Brass Messengers** CD release concert. We brought in 2012 with a New Year's Eve concert featuring the unique one-man band, **That 1 Guy**.

WINTER 2012

One of the mildest winters in Midwest history brought music fans out during a typically slower time of year. January alone saw seven sold-out shows. The old tyme of Minnesotans **Pert Near Sandstone** and **Charlie Parr, Cafe Accordion Orchestra,** and emerging Cuban salsa and son group **Malamanya** all made January a strong month. February continued the local trend with shows by **The Pines** and **Lucy Michelle & the**

Velvet Lapelles. It was a strong month for female indie artists: Sharon Van Etten, Laura Veirs, and My Brightest Diamond, the moniker of Shara Worden, all impressed Cedar audiences.

A sold-out performance in March by Atlas Sound, the side project of Bradford Cox of Deerhunter, put The Cedar in the national spotlight. Cox launched into an hour-long rendition of "My Sharona," which brought a confused but intrigued audience to their

feet. Thanks to cell phone videos of the performance that went viral, The Cedar was at the center of one of the more bizarre live music moments of the year.

Also notable in Winter of 2011 was a week-long residency with London-based Somali performer **Aar Maanta**. Aar was slated to headline our 2011 Global Roots Festival, but his band was not allowed entry in the U.S. due to visa issues. The band's visit was rescheduled for January 2012 and included workshops and site visits with local Somali youth groups and young adults.

SPRING 2012

May started off with a sold-out **Carolina Chocolate Drops** performance in standing room only configuration that paired nicely with their new, high-energy sound.

SUMMER 2012

The Cedar hosted several shows and two series in summer 2012: African Summer and our fourth annual Cedar Outdoors. African Summer was born out of the large number of African artists touring North America: We hosted an unprecedented eight performances by bands from all over the continent from June through August, including memorable concerts from Orchestre Poly-Rythmo (Republic of Benin), Johnny Clegg (South Africa), Spoek Mathambo (South Africa) and SMOD (Mali). The series concluded in spectacular fashion with a sold-out Amadou & Mariam (Mali) concert, which was surely one of the most memorable shows in Cedar history.

The fourth annual Cedar Outdoors music series also began in June with longtime Cedar favorite, **Charlie Parr**, kicking off two months of free music on our patio. The summer came to a close with performances by iconic figures and Rock N' Roll Hall of Famers **Mickey Hart** and **Leon Russell**.


FALL 2012


We launched The Cedar's 24th season in September 2012 with five concert events over four days, including an electronic music and large-scale light performance by virtuoso **Amon Tobin** (presented by the Cedar) at the Orpheum Theater. Tobin is Brazilian sound designer who uses video mapping techniques that are projected onto a large cubic structure; he has been described as "revolutionizing the live music experience." This was one of three major concerts The Cedar presented at other venues this fall in addition to performances by **Ani DiFranco** and **The Magnetic Fields** at First Avenue.

We hosted our fourth annual **Global Roots Festival** in September, which was completely free for the second year in a row. The 2012 Festival included two daytime programs and three nights of music by six different groups: **JPP** from Finland, **Trio Brasileiro** from Brazil, **MOVITS!** from Sweden, **MC Rai** from Tunisia, **M.A.K.U. Soundsystem**, an Afro-Colombian band based in New York, and **Rana Sanatacruz** from Mexico. This was our most successful Global Roots Festival to date: About 1,000









audience members came through our doors to see these musicians from all over the world.

We continued our outreach to the area's East African communities by hosting a play at the end of the month titled "Oromiya's Return" based on an Oromo folklore.

October began with two CD Release concerts by Dark Dark Dark who performed to a packed house both nights. Other local groups The Brass Messengers, Brute Heart, and The Chalice also graced The Cedar's stage in October. We presented a special daytime performance by Orange Mighty Trio for our partner WorkAbilities, a nonprofit organization based in Golden Valley that serves individuals with developmental disabilities.

In November, The Cedar ventured into the world of contemporary-classical with a performance by Now Ensemble, a chamber music group featuring the work of

Judd Greenstein. Greenstein is a composer out of New York who was most recently commissioned to create a series for the Minnesota Orchestra through their Inside the Classics program.



November was an extremely successful month for The Cedar in the way of resource development. We raised over \$33,500 through our Give to the


Max Day Campaign, which we dubbed Groove to the Max. The cornerstone of this campaign was the 24-hour fund drive on November 15th when philanthropists throughout the state were encouraged to make donations to their most beloved Minnesota-based nonprofits. The Cedar raised about \$27,000 on this day alone, placing 71st out of all nonprofits in the state for dollars raised and 15th in number of donors. Overall, 53,339 people donated \$16.3 million for more than 4,300 schools and organizations over the course of this day. Thank you to all those who participated: Your support makes Minnesota a better place to live and work. This month-long

campaign was crucial to support The Cedar's operating budget, allowing us to remain viable and continue bringing a diversity of acclaimed music to Minneapolis.

Also in November, we got word that we received a \$150,000 grant through McKnight Foundation's Region & Communities Program for a public space development project titled Faces of Cedar **Riverside**. The project was inspired by the recent and significant transformations in the Cedar Riverside neighborhood: The neighborhood's current infrastructure improvement provides the momentum for major positive change.

Finally, The Cedar was notified that we received an Arts Access grant from the Minnesota State Arts Board through the arts and cultural heritage fund as appropriated by the Minnesota State Legislature with money from the Legacy Amendment vote of the people of Minnesota on November 4, 2008. The Cedar will receive \$87,000 in 2013 to continue our work engaging the Somali immigrant and refugee communities in the Twin Cities Metro Area, with a focus on residents of Cedar Riverside. We will work with our many partner organizations in the Somali community to engage East African immigrants with our regularly scheduled concerts, present artists of particular interest to the community, develop events and programs that work towards our respective and collective goals, and support and cultivate local Somali artists.





STATE ARTS BOARD

FACES OF **CEDAR RIVERSIDE**

The City of Minneapolis completed a Cedar Riverside Small Area Plan in 2008, and clean, welcoming, and useful public spaces were identified as a clear priority. Each year, The Cedar plays an increasingly important role in the neighborhood by providing support and space for community organizations, developing programs that serve the surrounding communities, and engaging residents with our existing programs. Because The Cedar is both at the physical center and the cultural anchor of the community, the City of Minneapolis has asked us to spearhead a public space development effort in Cedar Riverside. Faces of Cedar **Riverside** will increase quality of life in the neighborhood with clean, comfortable, and appropriate gathering spaces; strengthen community by providing space where residents and workers of all ages and cultures feel welcome; facilitate positive extra curricular activities for area youth; improve economic activity with designated spaces for commerce including food carts, outdoor markets, and public concert performances; increase the success of businesses with better facades and comprehensive marketing strategies; and preserve the culture of the Somali residents with artist commissions.



These efforts include increasing access to the arts through ticket giveaways, strategic marketing, and special programs; workshops and presentation series that preserve traditional East African art forms; and working with partner organizations to identify community challenges and utilize the arts to address these problems.



GLOBAL ROOTS

Our GLOBAL ROOTS PROGRAM speaks to the core of The Cedar's mission: By presenting music from a diversity of cultures, and by engaging a diverse audience to experience this music together, these programs promote intercultural appreciation and understanding.
