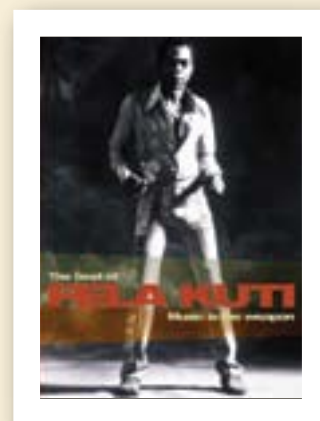

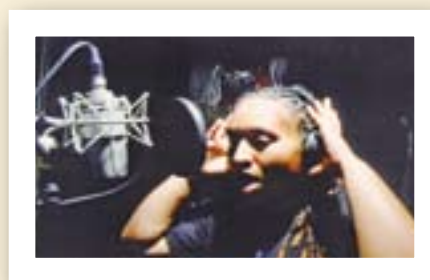

Fela Kuti's influence on black
contemporary music cannot be
overestimated; virtually all
modern forms of black music
(from funk to electronic) owe
something to his irresistible
Afrobeat groove. Filmed in Lagos,
Nigeria, in 1982, this 53-minute
documentary mixes footage of Fela
Anikulapo Kuti performing at his
Shrine nightclub, interviews
with the controversial musician,
glimpses of life at his not-
so-palatial Kalakuta Republic
compound, and scenes of Lagos street life.
